An Idaho Where ... Hope Prevails

For so long, Ali Mohammed's only focus had been keeping his family safe from stray bullets, mortars, and roadside bombs. After leaving the war-torn country of Afghanistan behind, Ali's family encountered new dangers. Once the Mohammed family was safe from imminent danger and resettled in Idaho, Ali had to find a way to provide for their basic needs.

Typically, it is expected that resettlement organizations support refugee families up to six months to ensure cultural integration, fluency in English, and economic self-sufficiency. Unfortunately, like so many other families new to our state, the Mohammad family was unable to fully reach these goals during initial support services. Due to our struggling economy and increasing numbers of refugees this situation is becoming the standard rather than the exception.

Searching for help, Ali found Catholic Charities of Idaho, where the Boise Family Strengthening Center assessed his needs and strengths and introduced him to the Individual Development Account (IDA) program. The IDA program instructs on financial literacy classes, educating individuals on savings and checking accounts, debit and credit cards, and how to create and maintain a household budget. Since many of our systems are foreign to newly settled refugees, these classes often mean the difference between paying rent and becoming homeless. The IDA program not only increases familial economic sufficiency, but also creates a unique opportunity to break the cycle of poverty with long-term solutions. Enrolled clients have the option to participate in a savings account where their deposit is matched 2:1 up to \$6,000.00 towards the purchase of a home, small business start-up, or higher education. The match is funded through a partnership with United Way of Treasure Valley.

Fully participating in the IDA program, Ali came to understand the Family Strengthening approach on economic stability as a pathway to success, rather than dependence on public assistance. Ali chose the route to higher education and was able to establish a long-term, self-sustaining solution

to meet his family's everyday needs. After entering the technical school for auto mechanics, Ali once again felt empowered and in control of his own destiny. The auto mechanics school allowed Ali to use his strengths in creating employment opportunities he was passionate about while continuing to provide for his family's basic needs.

While Ali was thankful for his new success, he was excited to witness the impact it had on his family. Ali's daughter, Ava, had experienced her family's hard economic struggles, and wanted a better life for herself. Understanding the impact education had made on her familial circumstances, Ava decided to attend college. Shortly after her 18th birthday Ava enrolled in the IDA program and was coming to better understand the same life lessons that had changed her family's future. Ava has been saving since February 2009 and hopes to make her first withdrawal to attend college this fall at Boise State University.

Providing the tools to help families escape the cycle of poverty creates hope and increases the economic stability of individuals and families. Stewardship of program funding and staff strengths created an opportunity for Catholic Charities of Idaho to invest in the stability of the greater Idaho community by providing education, and promoting economic justice for all.

An Idaho Where ... Justice Reigns

The threat of death was very real for Sara, as she attempted to silently maneuver her way through a violent, tumultuous six-year marriage. Afraid to report the habitual beatings, she continued to be victimized by the mental, emotional, and physical abuse.

Sara was not the only one who was a victim of the domestic violence. Michelle, the couple's only child, had been terrorized as she witnessed her father's brutal outbursts and physical blows which he regularly delivered to her mother. Michelle was scared for her mother's safety, but also her own life.

Michelle recalled the last night she spent in her parents' home in gruesome detail. Paralyzed by fear, Michelle witnessed her father deliver blow after blow to her mother's limp body. Only after her father lacerated her mother's face with a cooking pan did the violence end that night.

Then Sara saw the expression on her daughter's face, and through all she endured, nothing was worse to her than the look in Michelle's eyes.

While Sara feared additional retaliation, that was not the only thing stopping her from

reporting the abuse. The possibility of deportation was very real if Sara decided to go to authorities to report the violent behavior of her husband. Resolved that they had seen and taken enough, Sara felt the risk of deportation was worth ending the cycle of violence. What's most distressing about Sara and Michelle's story is that many women and children who have not completed their legal status in the United States share the same fear.

The most difficult group of individuals to reach is the unknown victim who may never call out for help. The U-Visa, an immigration rule specific to witnesses and victims of crime, was designed to create hope and promote justice by encouraging all victims of domestic violence to report their offenders without regard to the legal status of the victim.

After reporting her abuse, Sara went to a domestic violence shelter that provided refuge from the violence, and a referral to Catholic Charities of Idaho. At the time of her report, Sara did not know that reporting her abuse qualified her to apply for residency under the U-Visa. U-Visas also provide protection from the offender, and the ability to work legally in order to support innocent children affected by domestic violence. Sarah's choice helped to shelter her from further violence as she prepared to file for a U-Visa with the help of Catholic Charities of Idaho.

After a long, trying experience, with extensive case interviews and documentation required, Sara was informed that her U-Visa was finally approved last month. This application is one of the first to be approved in the State of Idaho. Hopefully by sharing this story, other families like Sara and Michelle will understand that no matter who you are or where you live, domestic violence should not be tolerated.

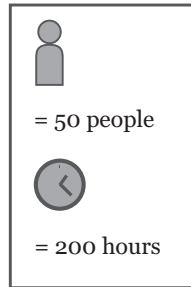
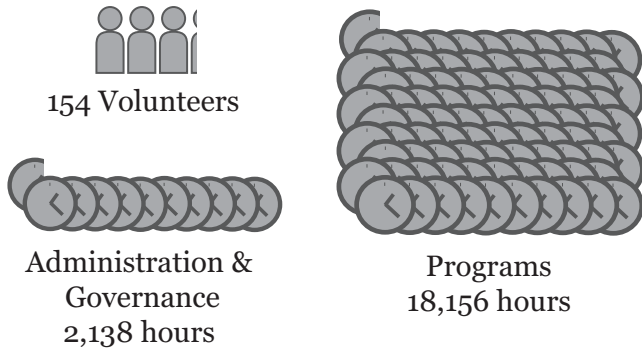

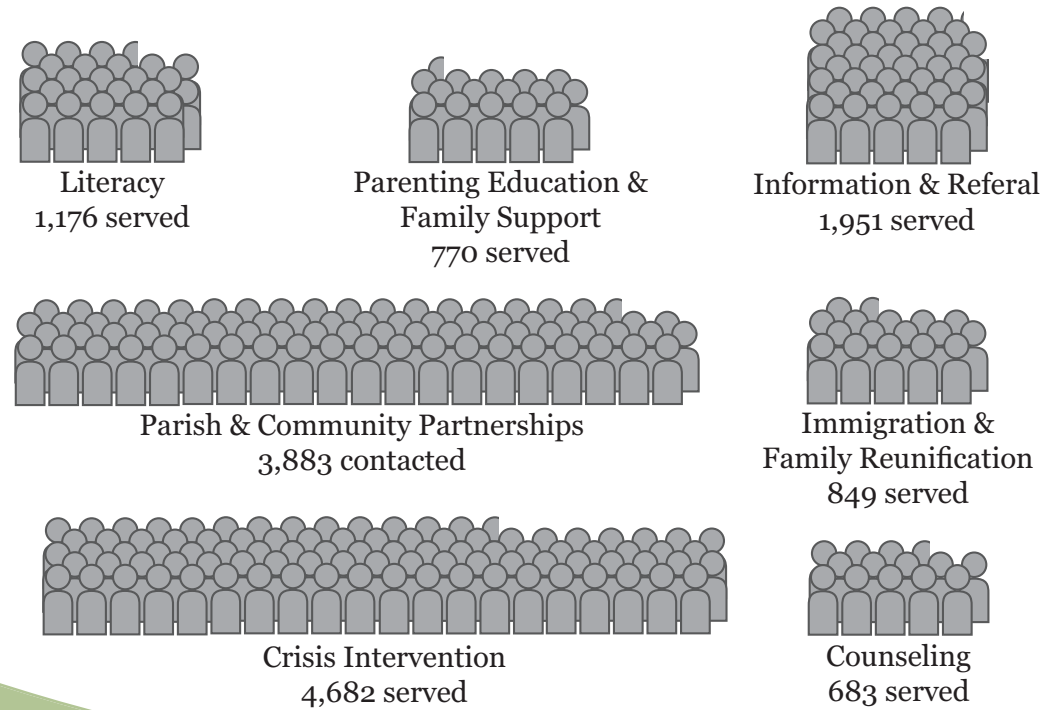

People Served



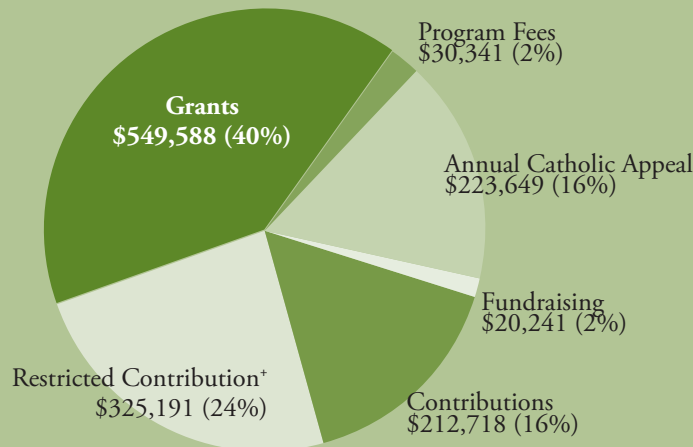
Fiscal Report

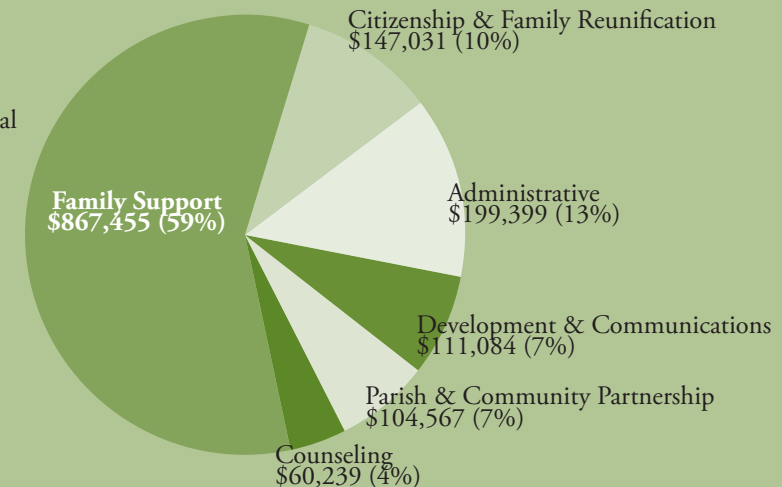
*Forecasted Figures

Ways of Helping

- **Bequest in Will or Revocable Living Trust**
A gift you make by naming CCI in your will for a certain dollar amount, a percentage of your estate or the residuary.
- **Charitable Gift Annuity**
A contract in which CCI agrees to pay you back a percentage of your gift annually for your lifetime.
- **Life Insurance**
