The disconnected find new friends with EVA's help

Nampa — La soledad se manifiesta en diversas maneras entre los que han sufrido pérdidas personales. Tres mujeres de Idaho viviendo con la pérdida de un miembro de la familia, se encontraron sufriendo de una manera triste y sola.

Virginia cuidaba a su madre moribunda de día y de noche hasta su último día. De repente Virginia estaba sola en la casa sin con quien hablar, reír, rezar, o servir. Su único compañero fue un sentimiento profundo de pérdida. Ella necesitaba amor y compañerismo.

Otra mujer, Florencia, había recién llegado al área y se sentía culpable. Ella se sentía que estaba abandonando a su hijo, quien se murió hace algunos años y fue enterrado en la comunidad en donde vivía antes. Ella dolía en su corazón porque no podía fácilmente visitar a la tumba de su hijo. Ella se entristeció porque no conocía a nadie en la comunidad. Ella necesitaba sentir incluida y valorada.

Rosario vivía con su hija pero deseaba tener mas amistades. Debido al hecho que no podía manejar, se sentía excluida y extrañaba ser parte de la comunidad. Ella quería hacer esta conexión de nuevo.

Estas tres mujeres encontraron la solución de sus problemas en Alva. Alva es una voluntaria con Caridades Católicas de Idaho (CCI). CCI provee voluntarios para cuidados de familias, proveyendo apoyo prolongado a miembros de la familia con enfermedades fatales. Por medio de este sistema de ayuda, se ha encontrado que cuando el miembro enfermo de la familia fallece, se queda una persona con un corazón quebrado sin nadie a quien se puede confiar.

Por medio de su coordinador de voluntarios, Alva empezó a facilitar un grupo de amistad para estas mujeres, las quienes no se conocerían de otro modo. Alva provee la transportación, una atmósfera que les ayuda a compartir sobre la jornada de sus vidas, y les da cariño a cada una de estas almas que estaban solas.

Caridades Católicas de Idaho es una de las agencias mas nuevas de Caridades Católicas en los Estados Unidos, incorporado en julio de 2000 y empezó dando servicios en junio de 2001. La agencia se esfuerza a avanzar la dignidad de individuos, familias, y comunidades por medio del fortalecer las familias, advocar justicia, y comprometer la comunidad a servir el bien común. CCI ofrece servicios a todas sin importar de la religión, edad, sexo, discapacidad, raza/ethnicidad, ganancia, o antecedentes.

NAMPA — Loneliness has many faces among those who have suffered personal loss. Three Idaho women living with the loss of a close family member found themselves suffering from nearly overwhelming grief and loneliness.

Virginia provided day and night care for her dying mother until her last day. When that day arrived, she suddenly found herself alone in the house, without anyone to talk to, laugh with, pray with or serve. Her only companion was a deep sense of loss. She needed love and companionship.

Florencia, had recently moved to the area and was feeling guilty about the move. She felt as though she had abandoned her son who had died several years earlier and was buried in the community where she previously lived. She was heartsick that she was no longer able to easily visit her son's grave. Feeling sad from living in a new and unfamiliar community and not knowing anyone, she experienced a sense of needing to be valued and included.

Rosario lived with her daughter but desired outside friendships too. She was no longer able to drive and found herself feeling excluded and missing the company of her friends. She missed the sense of belonging and camaraderie and wanted that connection back.

All three of these women found an answer in Alva. Alva is a volunteer with Catholic Charities of Idaho. CCI, through volunteers like Alva, offers volunteer respite for those providing long term care to family members with fatal diseases or diagnosis. Respite volunteers discovered that after the terminal family member dies, a caregiver is left with a broken heart and often no one to talk to or confide in.

Through her volunteer coordinator, Alva began to facilitate a friendship group for these women who had no other way to find or reach each other. That's when EVA (Empowering and Valuing the Aging) stepped in. Alva provides the transportation, offers an atmosphere that allows them to share about their life's journeys, and provides love and support to each other.

Catholic Charities of Idaho seeks to advance the dignity of individuals, families and communities by strengthening families, advocating justice and engaging the community to serve the common good.
